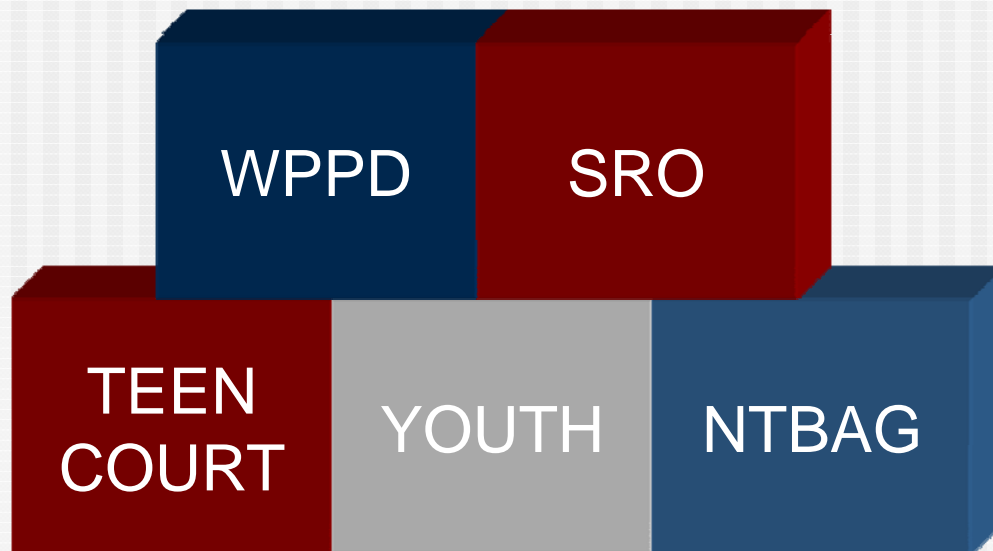

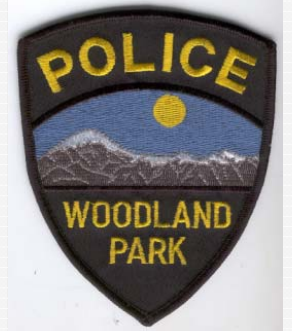

The Woodland Park Police Department has enjoyed a good working relationship with our alcohol vendors in the city for several years. Your diligence and dedication in checking for underage drinkers and underage alcoholic beverage purchases has been outstanding. It is hoped that your effort in checking for proper identification combined with our enforcement actions among the same age group has had the desired effect in deterring underage alcohol use.

We are pleased to have been awarded a grant by the Colorado Liquor Enforcement Division for continued education and enforcement activities to prevent underage purchases and consumption of alcoholic beverages. One of the components of our grant is the performance of compliance checks at alcohol vending outlets. # Revised Ordinance

CITY OF WOODLAND PARK, COLORADO

ORDINANCE NO. 1095, SERIES 2003

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 944 OF THE MUNICIPAL CODE OF THE CITY OF WOODLAND PARK, COLORADO CONCERNING POSSESSION AND/OR CONSUMPTION OF ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES BY AN UNDERAGE PERSON.

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Woodland Park has determined it to be in the best interest of the citizens of the City of Woodland Park to amend Chapter 944 of the Municipal Code concerning possession and/or consumption of alcoholic beverages by an underage person.

NOW, THEREFORE, THIS ORDINANCE:

THE CITY OF WOODLAND PARK, COLORADO, ORDAINS:

That an Ordinance entitled "AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 944 OF THE MUNICIPAL CODE OF THE CITY OF WOODLAND PARK, COLORADO CONCERNING POSSESSION AND/OR CONSUMPTION OF ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES BY AN UNDERAGE PERSON" be and the same is hereby enacted as follows:

Section 1. Section 944-010 Possession and/or consumption of alcoholic beverages by a minor is hereby amended and re-enacted to read as follows:

Possession and/or consumption of alcoholic beverages by an Underage Person.

A. Any person under the age of twenty-one (21) years who possesses and/or consumes alcoholic beverages in any place within the city shall be guilty of a violation of this Ordinance.

B. It shall be an affirmative defense to the offense described in this Section that the alcoholic beverage was possessed or consumed by a person under twenty-one years of age while such person was legally upon private property with the knowledge and consent of the owner or legal possessor of such private property and the alcoholic beverage was possessed or consumed with the consent of his/her parent or legal guardian who was present during such possession or consumption.

"Private property" means any dwelling and its outlots, which is possessed by a natural person or natural persons for habitation and which is not open to the public and privately owned real property which is not open to the public. "Private property" shall not include:

1. Any establishment which has or is required to have a license pursuant to Article 44, 47, or 48 of Title 12 of the Colorado Revised Statutes; or
2. Any establishment which sells alcoholic beverages or upon which alcoholic beverages are sold; or
3. Any establishment which leases, rents or provides accommodations to members of the public generally.

C. The possession or consumption of alcoholic beverages shall not be a violation if it takes place for a religious purpose protected by the first Amendment to the United States Constitution.

Section 2. All other sections of this Ordinance shall remain in full force and effect.

Section 3. Penalty. Upon conviction of the crime of possession and/or consumption of alcoholic beverages by an underage person the municipal court may sentence a minor offender to a term in the juvenile detention facility as provided by law and a fine not to exceed one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00) or both such fine and imprisonment. An adult convicted of this crime may be sentenced to a term in the County jail not to exceed one year or a fine of not to exceed one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00) or both such fine and imprisonment.
